Practice of Jesus

We fast because we are embodied, sinful, and dependent image-bearers of God.

Fasting is a way for our bodies to join with the rest of our being in expressing our brokenness over - and repentance of - sin.

Other Biblical examples of fasting as a way of expressing brokenness and repentance over sin:

1 Kings 21:27-29 - God pronounced judgement against Ahab, Ahab responds with fasting, God delays judgement.

1 Samuel 7:6 - After the Philistines take the Ark of the covenant, the Israelites "went all day without food and confessed that they had sinned."

Jonah 3:5 - In response to Jonah's message of God's judgement against their sin, the people of Nineveh believed God's message and fasted, and God relented of his judgement against Nineveh.

Acts 9:9 - Saul fasts after his encounter with Jesus on the road to Damascus exposed his sinfulness.
